

STRUCTURED INVOICE MANAGEMENT – CORPORATE IP DEPARTMENTS

FILING AND PROSECUTION: A MINEFIELD OF HIDDEN COSTS

Obtaining IP rights is key to any IP organisation. Filing and prosecution generally must be done under both monetary and human resources constraints as it typically takes a huge chunk out of your IP budget. Slight increases in these costs can make or break it.

Moreover, a lot of human efforts are necessary to instruct, monitor and control this complex process, and your team cannot grow as fast as your portfolio.

On top of those pains is a myriad of hidden costs (both direct and indirect) you may not think are significant but are putting even more pressure on your firm. Those costs can represent up to 15% of your total prosecution spend. Here are those hidden costs:



Direct hidden costs

- **Overcharges:** the invoice does not match the agreed cost schedule
- **Duplicate charges:** being charged for the same work twice
- **Miscellaneous charges:** unexpected charges for food expenses, taxi rides, conference calls, copies, postage, etc...

Indirect hidden costs

- **Invoice processing:** invoices quickly pile up, and matching line items with end clients for re-invoicing, as well as their controlling them takes a lot of time and effort.
- **International bank transfers:** every international bank transfer will incur additional bank charges
- **Foreign exchange:** you will receive invoices in multiple currencies, the best exchange rate is not always guaranteed
- **Payment terms:** you will not always have the best payment terms, which can put a strain your working capital

TACKLING HIDDEN COSTS

You probably already have a process to match and control invoices. You may even have an e-billing system to help you match invoices to the right case. These measures and tools can help you avoid some of the direct hidden costs, such as duplicate charges.

However, this actually creates a hidden cost as your paralegals and attorneys need to spend time controlling and validating invoices. This time is not spent on more substantive work.

Moreover, you will still incur most of the indirect hidden costs, such as high foreign currency exchange rates, bank transfer charges, and the strain on your working capital due to unfavourable payment terms on your invoices.

BUSINESS CASE: WHAT IS THE TOTAL HIDDEN COST?

Here is the case of a US company from the heavy industry, executing on average **230 filings annually in 10 major jurisdictions.**

An analysis of their invoices revealed that the hidden costs represented **14 percent** of the firm's total annual filing and prosecution costs.

Prosecution cost	\$2,288k
Hidden cost	\$374k

Total filing & prosecution costs \$2,662k

Duplicate & overcharges	\$57k
Miscellaneous charges	\$77k
Invoice processing	\$94k
International bank transfer charges	\$31k
Foreign exchange	\$92k
Payment terms	\$23k

Total - Hidden costs \$374k
